



FGF Doctoral Program, Class of 2020 How to successfully design, craft and publish entrepreneurship and innovation research

Program description: The program goes from August 2020 to November 2020 and introduces doctoral students to academic writing and publishing in entrepreneurship and innovation research. The program is ideally suited for first and second year doctoral students; but also later-stage doctoral students can benefit. The program follows the concept of blended learning and combines elements of online interaction with traditional place-based classroom learning. The participants will also build a network of fellow doctoral students across the DACH region. Moreover, they will have the chance to present their own doctoral research and receive feedback on their dissertation project. The program language is English.

Program instructors: The program is led by Prof. Dr. Jörn Block (Universität Trier) and Dr. Christian Fisch (Universität Trier), who publish regularly in the leading journals of entrepreneurship and innovation research such as JBV, Research Policy, and ETP. The local host is Prof. Dr. Richard Geibel (Hochschule Fresenius, Köln).
